For nearly 100 years, Seabeck Conference Center has provided a nurturing place for families, individuals, and nonprofit groups from around the Puget Sound and beyond. The campus comprises spectacular natural beauty and the resources to support a range of activities promoting learning, fellowship, and renewal. The Center serves nearly 10,000 visitors each year and has become a touchstone in the lives of many generations. Visitors describe crossing the bridge over the old mill pond to enter the campus as a passage from the cares and stresses of modern life into a place of peace and connection. The view across the canal to the snow-capped Olympic Mountains, the towering conifers that fill the hillside, and the gnarled but resilient apple trees are all part of a guest's experience in this very special place.

The Centennial Campaign is an investment in the next 100 years to ensure that the Seabeck Conference Center remains physically, ecologically, and financially sustainable. The first phase of the campaign will raise \$2.5 million to address high- priority projects including:

- **Building two new guest houses offering 16 rooms, 32 beds, and 16 bathrooms which will allow two outdated facilities, Manzanita and Alder, to be repurposed or removed**
- **Renovating an underused building, Juniper, for meeting and small group dining use**
- **Creating an outdoor amphitheater**
- **Providing support amenities including a new delivery facility and maintenance building**
- **Installing landscaping and access to the new houses**

The campaign is the collective vision of many individuals who know the value of this unique place and are committed to its model of service and stewardship. The Center is among a very few comparable resources in the nation that specifically serve families and nonprofit organizations dedicated to promoting social engagement and enrichment for all ages. The Seabeck Conference Center holds a hundred years of stories that represent community at its best. The Centennial Campaign will ensure that future generations continue the tradition.
